background history

John Atholl Hammet (1802-87) was the son of John Hammet (1767-1811) and his wife Elizabeth Woodford. He had two brothers, Frederick and Charles, and a sister, Gertrude.

John Hammet senior was MP for Taunton, 1800-11, and from 1799 was a partner in the London bank Sir James Esdaile, Esdaile, Hammet, Esdaile, & Hammet. After his death at the age of 43, his banking interest was assumed by his younger brother James Esdaile Hammet. John Atholl Hammet himself joined the firm as a youth in 1819, and was promoted to partner in 1825.

John Atholl Hammet married Sybella Daniel in 1829. His uncle, Sir Ralph Jones Woodford (c.1748-1828), was governor of Trinidad, West Indies, from 1813 to 1828, where his brother Frederick also settled.

By the early 1830s the Hammet family had relinquished their interest in the bank, which failed in 1837.
